



The Diary of Anne Frank Director's Note

"How do we remember the victims, their solitude, their helplessness? They left us without a trace, and we are their trace."- Elie Wiesel

I met Anne Frank when I was 13 years old. The same age she was when she received her diary, and began writing down words that would capture me as a 13 year old girl, years later, across an ocean and inspire great change and hope for hundreds of people. From that moment in my English class, I became dedicated to educating myself on Anne's story, and from there the stories of many other Holocaust survivors. I have spent many years reading, watching and bearing witness to accounts from the Holocaust. I believe that education is the only way we can prevent things like this from ever happening again.

Being gifted this opportunity to Direct *The Diary of Anne Frank*, is a true honor that 13 year old Rachel would never believe was happening. I want to take a moment to thank my incredible English teacher, Mr.Keith Sanzen, who introduced Anne's story to me and ensured her words were a part of our education. I also want to acknowledge Mr. Ken Abrams who continued to educate us on the events of WW2 and encouraged me to enter a writing contest held by the Jewish Cultural Center of Providence. Winning this contest with a story I created about the Holocaust continued my deep passion for expanding my knowledge of WW2.

The Diary of Anne Frank Director's Note

My hope for this performance is to spread Anne's message of hope and her ability to find joy despite challenges faced in life. Anne faced more trauma and challenges than any of us will face in a lifetime and until the very end she was able to find the small joys in her life. Fighting the temptation to be drowned in misery she remained a light of joy in everyone's life.

The cast and crew of this production have been the biggest supporters of our unified mission to lift up the voices of Anne and her family. In a time where people are fighting to erase the words of those like Anne, we as a cast and crew understand the importance and power of words and people's access to stories will always be a vital part of human history. "Paper has more patience than people" - Anne Frank June 20th 1942

We strive to be the trace left by Anne's story and share it with as many people as possible. History demands to be told and brave voices must never be forgotten.


Rachel Terceira: Director

Rachel is honored to be directing this important and impactful production of *The Diary of Anne Frank*. Rachel's love, appreciation, and research into Anne's life started back in 2012, and she is so blessed to finally have the chance to bring her story to life. She has been dancing and acting since the age of seven and received her BA in theater from Rhode Island College, where she focused on all elements of technical theater, working on such productions as *Rocky Horror*, *Much Ado About Nothing*, and *Awake and Sing*. Her on-stage credits include Kristine in *A Chorus Line* and Glinda in *The Wizard of Oz*. Rachel credits much of her success as a director to her two biggest mentors, Rob Ferland and Herci Marsden.



Olivia Tavares: Anne Frank

Olivia is a ninth grader at Wheeler High School in North Stonington. She has been acting on stage since she was five years old. Recent performances include Portia in Rodgers & Hammerstein's Cinderella Jr., Miss Hannigan in Annie Jr.—both with North Stonington Rec Drama—and Mrs. Peacock in Clue with Wheeler Drama. This summer, she played Dromio of Ephesus in The Comedy of Errors with the Shakespeare Theater Company's teen program in Washington, DC. When not acting, Olivia can be found fencing competitively for RI Fencing Academy and Club. She is thrilled to be making her debut with The Bradley Playhouse and would like to thank Rachel, Kat, and the cast and crew for making this an amazing experience.



Dave Clark: Otto Frank

Dave first appeared on the Bradley stage 31 years ago, before many in the cast and crew in this production were born, as Murray in *A Thousand Clowns*. Four years later, he returned as Porter Milgrim in *Deathtrap* and recently was seen as Francis Nurse in *The Crucible*. He has been seen several times in between at the Bradley in the role of Audience Member. 




~ A Note from Your TNECT President ~
