The Prom Director's Note



"One thing's universal, life's no dress rehearsal."

These lyrics are sung many times throughout *The Prom*, and the more time I have had to sit with them, the more they really mean. We get one opportunity to make our mark in this world, and it would be foolish of any of us to waste it. For me, this is the big takeaway from *The Prom* when you really peel back all the layers. There are a myriad of important and timely themes that this show asks us to examine, all of which are worth our energy, but what it all really comes down to is, what is your impact on the world around you? If you ask yourself that question and you don't like the answer, the good news is that there is still time to become the person you want to be. It's a hard lesson to learn but if you ask DeeDee, Barry, and all their friends, they might tell you all it takes is a little stage lighting, a song and dance break, and one tenacious teenager to change their entire perception of reality.

I had the opportunity to see *The Prom* in its original incarnation on Broadway, and it was one of those shows that left you just feeling a little bit better about life outside the theater. The world feels like a tumultuous place right now; every headline is fueled with hate and intolerance and makes you want to pull the covers back over your head and try again tomorrow. That is part of what Emma, the heroine of our show, feels right from the start. As a small-town girl stuck in an ecosystem that does not encourage her to thrive, Emma is bullied and beaten down every day just for having the courage to live her truth. A simple declaration of coming out and Emma's entire world is thrown upside down, forcing her to examine just how much strength she has to be able to live authentically and unapologetically.







The Prom Director's Note



Unfortunately, this is all too real for many young people, even in 2025. We live in a world where being gay is still not accepted by many people, where slurs are still yelled out of passing cars and where many feel it is still safer to live in the closet, not willing to share who they truly are for fear of being persecuted. There is no doubt that we have come a long way in the fight for equal rights but boy, do we still have a long way to go. I wish that more people could have Emma's courage and know how beautiful it is to live in the light without fear. However, for that to happen, we all need to continue to educate those around us and push past the boundaries of bigotry and small-minded thinking. This is what is so special to me about this particular show, it encourages us to think bigger, to ask questions, and to truly try to see from your neighbors' point of view. We all think we know everything. I am guilty of it on a regular basis. However, when I sit back and try to see something from another viewpoint, I am often surprised to learn something I didn't know before. This truly is the point; don't be afraid to ask questions and don't be too proud to admit maybe you were wrong.

Helming this production is something I am very proud of. Putting this cast together, it was very evident, very quickly, that we had a special group of people who were going to tell this story and do it justice. I am very fortunate to be working with some old friends as well as some new ones to bring this joyful tale to the mainstage at the Bradley. This is my second time directing here and I have to reflect on what a welcoming and special place this is to get to be creative. It takes a village to put on a blockbuster musical, and I would be lost in the cornfields of Indiana without my incredible team.

We all share a vision of why this show is so special and why it is important to be sharing it with you all on this stage. I am grateful every day for the collaboration I have both on and off the stage to be able to bring this show to life. Directing wasn't my first love, but it has become one of my great loves. A big, special thank you to the board here for inviting me back to play in this sandbox and create this beautiful magic.

To you, our audience, thank you for spending your time and hard-earned money with us here. I sincerely hope that this production brings you a few moments of respite from the outside world and transports you to a place where kindness really does win in the end, and where fairy tales really do come true.

This marvel of a show truly is timely, and it is important. While it's filled with joy and laughter, it is also filled with devastating heartbreak and forces us to look at our impact on the world and the people around us. 
We invite you all to join us on our journey, with an open mind and open heart. Perhaps, together, we can make our tiny corner of the world a better place.


