Murder on the Orient Express Director's Note

In 1883, Belgian businessman Georges Nagelmackers founded La Compagnie Internationale des Wagons-Lits (International Sleeping-Car Company) following a visit to the United States and being inspired by the luxurious sleeper cars of George Pullman. Originally known as Express d'Orient, the name was changed in 1891 to Orient Express. Its itineraries and services included the Simplon Orient Express and the Arlberg Orient Express, running several different routes between Paris and Istanbul. The initial run in October of 1883 included ferry service as well, as the full rail connection was not completed until 1889. With the exception of interrupted service during World Wars I and II, the lines were known for first class accommodations with sleeping and restaurant cars providing unparalleled comfort and fine cuisine to royalty, celebrities, and spies. The Orient Express of popular imagination ceased to operate in 1977, although various portions of the original route are still available to travelers to this day either via Budapest & Bucharest, or through Zagreb, Belgrade & Sofia. Agatha Christie's Murder on the Orient Express is set on the Simplon Orient Express, which linked Calais, Paris, and Istanbul on a daily basis.

Murder on the Orient Express Director's Note (Cont.)

The detective novel Murder on the Orient Express, published in 1934, quickly became popular as it linked Christie's most famous character, Hercule Poirot, with the glamorous setting of the luxurious Orient Express. It is, by his own admission, Poirot's most challenging case with too many clues and suspects, and he must rely on his "little grey cells" to unravel deceit, lies, and long held secrets. The story is influenced by some real-world events. As a frequent passenger herself, Christie was no stranger to the Orient Express, having first journeyed on the train in 1928. For writing inspiration, she had her personal observation skills to view both the behavior of others during her travels, as well as the wellappointed surroundings. In addition, one trip of her own was interrupted by flooding, and Christie certainly heard of the stranding for six days in Turkey by a snow drift in 1929 to use for her book. And finally, the tragic Lindbergh baby kidnapping in 1932. Events in the novel are drawn from this infamous case. In the end, Murder on the Orient Express is more than a detective mystery. It is a meditation on justice, morality, and the insufficiency of law, as Poirot is faced with an ambiguous moral dilemma that challenges his own rigid code of right and wrong to the core.

Queen of Crime – Penned 66 detective novels, 14 short story collections, and 16 plays.

Record-Setting Playwright – *The Mousetrap* has been running in London since 1952 and celebrated its 30,000th performance on March 19, 2025.

Global Bestseller – *And Then There Were None* has sold over 100 million copies.

Dame of Mystery – Honored with Dame Commander of the Order of the British Empire (DBE) in 1971 for her contributions to literature.

Globe-Trotting Inspiration – Adventures with her archaeologist husband inspired novels like *Death on the Nile* and *Murder on the Orient Express*.

Clues Everywhere – Known for clever plot twists, hidden clues, and shocking endings.

Unstoppable Legacy – Her works have sold over 2 billion copies, making her one of history's best-selling authors.




Ken Ludwig has had six productions on Broadway and eight in London's West End. His 34 plays and musicals are staged around the world and throughout the United States every night of the year.

His first play, Lend Me a Tenor, won two Tony Awards and was called "one of the classic comedies of the 20th century" by The Washington Post. Crazy For You is currently running on London's West End. It was previously on Broadway for five years, on the West End for three, and won the Tony and Olivier Awards for Best Musical.

In addition, he has won the Edwin Forrest Award for Contributions to the American Theatre, two Laurence Olivier Awards, two Helen Hayes Awards, the Charles MacArthur Award and the Edgar Award for Best Mystery of the Year. His other plays include Moon Over Buffalo, Leading Ladies, Baskerville, Sherwood, Twentieth Century, Dear Jack, Dear Louise, A Fox on the Fairway, A Comedy of Tenors, The Game's Afoot, Shakespeare in Hollywood and Murder on the Orient Express. They have starred, among others, Alec Baldwin, Carol Burnett, Kristen Bell, Tony Shaloub, Joan Collins and Henry Goodman.

His book How to Teach Your Children Shakespeare, published by Penguin Random House, won the Falstaff Award for Best Shakespeare Book of the Year, and his essays on theatre are published in the Yale Review. He gives the Annual Ken Ludwig Playwriting Scholarship at the Kennedy Center American College Theater Festival, and he served on the Board of Governors for the Folger Shakespeare Library for ten years. His first opera, Tenor Overboard, opened at the Glimmerglass Festival in July 2022. His most recent world premieres were Lend Me A Soprano and Moriarty, and his newest plays and musicals include Pride and Prejudice Part 2: Napoleon at Pemberley and Lady Molly of Scotland Yard.

His plays include commissions from the Agatha Christie Estate, the Royal Shakespeare Company, The Old Globe Theatre, and the Bristol Old Vic. For more information visit www.kenludwig.com.



Preston has also been seen around Rhode Island and Connecticut in such shows as Les Miserables, Spamalot, Jekyll & Hyde, The Complete Works of Shakespeare (Abridged), and Raisin in the Sun. Favorite roles in the past have included Seymour in Little Shop of Horrors, John Adams in 1776, Finch in How to Succeed in Business..., Narrator/Mysterious Man in Into the Woods, and Captain Von Trapp in The Sound of Music. 




